Erasmus students who are planning to study for a semester at American College are advised to select the courses they would like to study based on the above information and complete a learning agreement. The week before classes start in a semester, a student may have to revise the courses he/she will enroll in, based on which courses are actually offered in the particular semester and based on the days and time these courses are offered. If the courses a student will eventually enroll in, differ from the ones written on his/her learning agreement, he/she will have to get his/her home institution approval for the change, revise his/her learning agreement accordingly and have it signed.
